BOB MCCLURE APPOINTED AS NEW JAMES MADISON INSTITUTE PRESIDENT and CEO
Tallahassee Native to Assume Day-to-Day Responsibilities June 14

TALLAHASSEE – James Madison Institute Founder J. Stanley Marshall announced today the appointment of J. Robert “Bob” McClure III as the Institute’s new president and CEO. McClure will assume the post on Monday, June 14.

“Bob McClure brings exactly the qualities needed in the JMI presidency: belief in the principles and values on which the Institute was founded; solid experience in managing an organization, research, writing and fundraising; and skill in human relations,” Marshall said. “I believe that under Bob’s leadership, JMI’s best days will lie ahead,” he added.

McClure comes to JMI from the St. John’s Episcopal Foundation in Tallahassee, where he was executive director for two years. McClure has over 15 years’ experience in independent education as a teacher and administrator, and was a consultant to several K-12 institutions throughout the country. McClure was appointed previously to the State of Florida Education Strategic Planning Council and the Florida Elections Commission. He has also served in various roles with Leadership Tallahassee, United Way, Rotary Club of Tallahassee, World Class Schools of Leon County, and the Tallahassee Chamber of Commerce.

McClure replaces J. Stanley Marshall, who has served as interim CEO since June 2003. L. Charles Hilton was recently appointed as chairman of the Institute’s Board of Directors; Marshall will remain as vice-chairman of the Board.
